It was eventually decided after further emails and phone calls that the focus of the group would be better spent on different subjects that were not as controversial due to differing state definitions in their respective law and/or the different definitions in academia. Subject may be revisited at a later date if requested by the ASPCRO Board but it was agreed that at this time it was not in line with the mission statement of the committee.

In conclusion, an Anti-Microbial Fact Sheet will be developed by the committee and be presented to the ASPCRO Board for any edits, suggestions, and approval upon completion of the committee's final draft.
