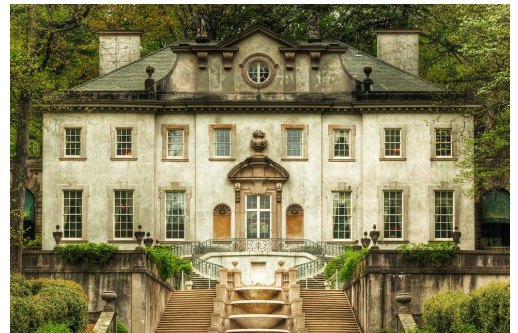
ASPCRO Opening Reception (Sunday, 6–8 p.m.)

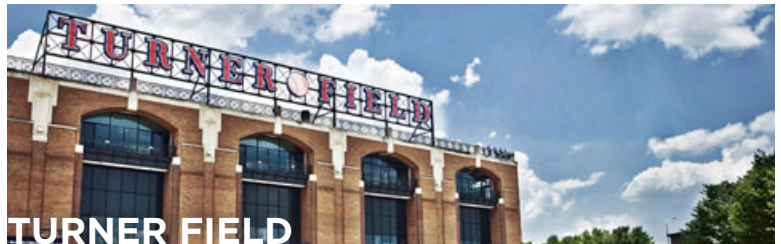
