eCommerce State Efforts in a Flat World

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Technology and Globalization

The internet and expansion of related technology has resulted in a "flat world":

- Trading of goods and services worldwide across markets;
- Spread of knowledge of and use of technology;
- Increasing expectation of utilization of technology in "business".

eCommerce - the internet sale of pesticides - is not something new for regulators:

- "Surf Day";
- Some States/Tribes/Territories do routinely complete eCommerce inspections; and
- EPA efforts nationally for sale of unregistered pesticides.

However, with the pandemic, pesticide regulatory officials have seen an increase in the online sales of pesticide products and with-it increasing concerns.

Increasing Areas of Concern


- Concerns regarding the sale pesticides and the potential for adverse impacts from use to human or environmental health:
 - Unregistered (Federal/State);
 - Specific claims, i.e., efficacy, safety; and
 - Misbranding.
- Concerns are not limited to restricted use pesticides rather all pesticides including those not subject to federal registration;
- Concerns regarding the ability to regulate the virtual marketplace:
 - Resources;
 - Technology vs Technology;
 - Locating Sellers; and
 - Gaining and Maintaining Compliance.

eCommerce Workgroup


- Formed in 2022 to identify and discuss issues related to the "virtual" world.
- Initially, small workgroup comprised of state lead agencies and EPA OECA with the expectation of growth overtime.
- With a look towards the future and how best to incorporate these activities into the Cooperative Agreement, the workgroup decided to begin by collecting information regarding current e-commerce activities.
- Survey was distributed to States/Tribes/Territories on February 22, 2023.
- 46 Responses!

Updated Survey Results: Do You Conduct eCommerce Inspections?

- 17 or ~37% conduct eCommerce Inspections
 - 66% have guidelines
 - 19% have developed specific forms
 - 71% indicated eCommerce Inspection hold same priority as routine/in person inspections
 - 86% use simple internet search



- 29 or ~ 63% that do not conduct eCommerce Inspections
 - 75% said they would like to start doing these types of inspections
 - 96% indicated they would find guidelines helpful
 - When asked why they did not complete eCommerce Inspections
 - Time/resource constraints
 - Use of Grant Funding
 - Don't know where to start/overwhelming
