Federal Legislation: The Farm Bill

- Our Goal: Codify state pesticide preemption, maintaining the status quo in 45 states and ensuring that federal and state regulators maintain cooperative oversight over pesticide regulations throughout the U.S.
 - Language included in the House bill, which passed the Committee on Agriculture in May 2024.
 - Senate Majority/Minority Framework versions are conflicting.



Federal Regulation: EPA Actions

- FIFRA's Compliance with Endangered Species Act (ESA)
 - Vulnerable Species Pilot Project (VSPP)
 - Insecticide Strategy
 - Herbicide/Rodenticide Strategy

- Registration Decisions
 - OMalathion PID
 - OAcephate PID
 - Sulfuryl Flouride



Professional Pest Management: Issues in the States

Legislation:

- State Pesticide Preemption
 - Local Ordinances
- Chemistry Restrictions
 - Neonicotinoids
 - Rodenticides
- PFAS Definition and Prohibition
 - 1-carbon definition (ME, MN)

Regulation:

- C&T Plan Updates
 - Engaging on rulemaking/legislative process.
- Integrated Pest Management
 - Research School IPM
- Professional Applicator "Special" Interests
 - Fee increases, licensing changes, etc.



NPMA in Your State

- Our state policy affairs representatives (SPARs), are the instate contact for the professional pest management industry.
 - Volunteers from the state pest management associations, they know the state's industry/issues.
- SPARs proactively engaged in the state legislature and with state regulators.
 - Their goal is to share accurate information regarding the industry while providing feedback on proposals that would affect our ability to operate.
