

Born in Camden, South Carolina, James H. Wright graduated from Camden High School and subsequently entered the U.S. Air Force, where he served for four years gaining experience in electronics maintenance. Upon discharge from the Air Force, Jim continued his formal education, and in 1978 obtained a Bachelor of Science degree from Clemson University in plant sciences with emphasis in ornamental horticulture and a minor in entomology.
